

"GUIDELINES FOR USING NUDE HUMAN SUBJECTS FOR MODELING"

The policies listed below are guidelines for using human subjects for photography or figure drawing within the facilities of the architectural program. The policies are suggestions of the architectural students, faculty and staff and immediately go into effect Fall Semester of 2003. The purpose of the policy is to allow the use of human subjects for modeling and to provide confidentially.

All nude modeling should take place in a classroom environment

All nude models used should be professionals and 21 years of age or older.
Students are not allowed to be nude models.
Students may be used as models if they are fully clothed.

Written permission should be granted prior to any professional or student modeling. (See the attached agreement form.)

Photographs used for display should not reveal facial features.

Additional objects, equipment, or other items in the photograph with a nude model may be used, if used appropriately.

The following rooms can be used for modeling purposes only during the university hours of 9:00 am – 5:00pm, Monday thru Friday (N003, N175, N174, and N173).

When nude modeling takes place all rooms having window areas should be properly secured and shielded from public view.

GENERAL

In all photographs no offensive written language and graphic material will be displayed. Photographs used for class assignments should be approved by the course professor. When using nude professional models approval and any reimbursements should come from the department chairperson.

Violators of the above mentioned policies are subject to immediate disciplinary actions.
